This is his second year with the school. He would not be educated without this school.


He has severe Tourette's Syndrome with ADHD, and it would be impossible for him to endure what would come attending a regular public school from the bullying to the upset teachers. My husband and I both agreed this evening, that if we could be hypothetically granted one "do-over", we would never have put Joseph in a regular brick-and-mortar school. We both think the stress and anxiety that it placed on him, increased his illness. He had school refusal by Thanksgiving time in Kindergarten. I wish I had known about VAVA and just pulled him out. Instead, I got told what a terrible parent I was by the principal of Joseph's school. I had no idea how ill my child was truly becoming. The administrators and teachers at VAVA have only been supportive and helpful to our family. Joseph reads at a 4th grade level and he can divide double digits already this school year. It is a wonderful program and I don't know what we would do without it. Please keep our school open. One size does not always fit all, that is why we need options.

Who Chooses Virtual Schooling?

- Students on homebound instruction with medical needs
- Students with special education needs (autism, ADHD)
 ~20% of VAVA's students
- Students with gifted education needs want to be challenged and move at their own pace
- Military families who move frequently ~18% of VAVA's students
- Competitive athletes with conflicts with traditional school hours
- Students who are falling further behind with grade level skills and have struggled with state testing
- Students who are dissatisfied with their current traditional public school (overcrowding, bullying, lack of rigor, etc.)
















Virginia Virtual Academy Timeline

Parents must tell their local schools of their intention; no approval is required.

Parents must submit "description of curriculum" list of subjects they intend to teach. There are no attendance, testing or accountability requirements.

Take state-mandated SOL tests


Students supervised by Highly Qualified Virginia certified teachers

Location of VAVA Students



Required Approved Curriculum

- Students are enrolled in a full day program that includes 6 courses (Math, L/A, Science, History, art and music or world languages)
- All courses approved by VADOE in Multidivision Online Provider approval process in spring 2011 including health/PE. Re-approved in 2012, 2013 and 2014.
- K^{12 is} AdvancED-accredited

Materials **shipped to family's home** (books, materials, manipulative objects, paint, rocks!) – combination of offline work and online lessons








Virginia Standards of Learning Assessments

- Mandatory participation in SOL's for Grades 3-8





Individualized assessment and instructional plan developed

Each student is given a diagnostic assessment upon entrance and has an **Individualized Learning Plan** created by the Virginia certified teacher based on the individual results, needs and planned goals with the learning coach.





The Role of the VAVA Learning Coach

- Logs attendance daily
- Checks Kmail daily and responds promptly
- Works with student towards continuous, consistent progress with all required K¹² courses
- Prepares for student's school day using Advance Prep tools
- Participates in regular teacher conference calls/Class Connect sessions and parent online training offerings
- Submits monthly work samples
- Ensures student participation in Study Island
- Ensures the student completes Scantron assessments
- Ensure student participation in state testing program
 - May 10-21 (attendance required for students in grades 3-8)





The Role of a VAVA teacher

- Communicate with students and learning coaches
- Speak with each student & family during monthly parent teacher conferences over the telephone and in our virtual classroom for writing work sample feedback and one on one tutoring
- Monitor progress and attendance
- Maintain communication notes in Total View
- Create progress reports and Individualized Learning Plans (ILPs)
- Hold live synchronous class sessions
- Prepare students for VA state testing






VAVA teachers ensure that students:

- •Login every school day using their own account to complete school work in core curricular subjects.
- Attendance may be logged any day at any hour 24/7
 990 hours per calendar year of instructional time required
- •Independently complete unit and lessons <u>assessments</u> to ensure true mastery.
- 95% mastery in four core subjects (math, reading, science, history) required for promotion by last day of school (grades K-8)
- •Participate in test preparation program, Study Island, Class Connect sessions, Scantron assessments, and SOL testing (3rd-6th grade).
- Conference regularly with teachers
- Attend class connect sessions





Student Progress: Mastery based








Real Time Data

By clicking here, the teacher can see which student did not master the concept Teachers are able to see how many students have completed, mastered or did not master an assessment. She can then use this data to provide an intervention or drive instruction.









Real Time Data


Teachers are able to see assessment scores, day and time stamps for assessment completion as well as how long it took the student to complete the test.

All special education students attending VAVA now receiving services from their district of enrollment.





VAVA Survey Results: Parent Satisfaction with Special Education Services

- 96% feel their concerns are being addressed
- 93% feel their student is making progress on IEP goals
- 93% feel the special education teacher understands their student's needs
- 99% feel the teacher provides sufficient support
- 86% feel their student will be successful on state tests

Current Challenges

- Multiple local contracts for current VAVA program
 - Annual contracts with multiple districts create renewal challenges
 - Limits long-term commitment to families
- Local enrollment caps
 - Limit student ability to enroll or stay in VAVA
- Grade level limitations (k-6)
- Funding formula
- Districts can charge parents a fee
- Some districts select students to participate
